TROY CHAMBER AUGUST 2023 MINUTES

President, Bonnie Seeley, introduced Guest Speaker, Joy Laue, from the Troy Alumni Association, at the Troy Chamber meeting on Wednesday, Aug. 2.

Laue announced the Troy High School building will be 100 years old this year. A large Centennial celebration is being planned for October 6 - 8.

Laue wanted to see if Chamber members would want to assist with making it a great event in downtown Troy. Her goal is for people coming to this event, to patronize many businesses in the area. She indicated it is not just a celebration of the building, but to really celebrate all the people who are alumni, faculty and staff that used to work or study at Troy.

Also, Laue wanted to include all the Chamber businesses since 90% of businesses in Troy are managed and run by people, along with workers, who are in Troy alumni.

In an effort to make it a convenient time for everyone to attend, including students who are enrolled in college, people with businesses, and employees, the Association chose Columbus Day weekend, when schools and many businesses are closed, which is the first weekend in October.

Upon Laue advising the Chamber what is all being planned, she requested the Chamber to see if they could assist with funding a part of it, such as some of the Friday evening events. In addition, Laue is asking all Chamber members for donations for a basket raffle.

"We can support the Chamber and the Chamber can support us," said Laue.

Also, to help raise funds, the Alumni Association will be selling a Logo to put in the windows of local businesses.

Elizabeth Ward advised the Hometown Heroes banners have held up extraordinarily well and will try to get in touch with the vendor again.

With regard to merchandise, the Troy School District building will be the building this year, to commemorate the 100th year. The ornament will be the Troy Vets Club.
